Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT)

The Champaign County Multidisciplinary Team (MDT) consists of the Champaign County State's Attorney's Office, 26 local law enforcement agencies, the Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS), CAC staff, local mental health providers, and medical personnel.

- # counseling hours provided to victims and their non-offending caregivers: 460 hours
- Formal Case Review meetings with the MDT: 11 (1 MDT meeting was canceled due to COVID-19)
- Non-offending parents/caregivers served: 229
- The MDT conducted pre and/or post interview meetings for 100% of the interviews
- CAC staff conducted mandated reporter training
- 48 MDT members participated in a secondary trauma training (SHIFT Supporting Heroes in Metal Health Foundation Training) hosted by the CAC and the Illinois Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force.
- The MDT participated in a case review assessment provided by the Children's Advocacy Center of Illinois.
- The CAC installed a video monitoring system to ensure full time observation of children at the facility.
- 8 MDT members attended the 2020 Champions for Children Conference
- 16 MDT members attended the Carle sex abuse conference featuring Corey Jewel Jensen
- The CAC displayed 12 blue kids through Champaign County for Child Abuse Prevention Month
- The CAC welcomed Jenna Gilchrist as the new Family Advocate
