COUNTY ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2023-7

NOTICES TO APPEAR

Effective immediately, the Champaign County Sheriff and officers under his command are authorized to issue Notices to Appear in court, even after a finding of probable cause pursuant to *Gerstein v. Pugh*, for any person arrested on a new charge or on a warrant when the new charge or warrant's underlying offense is an ordinance violation, petty traffic, conservation offense, misdemeanor, or felony and where the offense is non-detainable under the Illinois pretrial release statutes, currently 725 ILCS 5/110-1 et seq (SAFE-T and Pretrial Fairness Acts). The Sheriff and his officers may rely on any information available at the time of a person's booking to determine if the offense is non-detainable including, but not limited to, reports from arresting officers and communications from prosecutors and defense attorneys.

Authority to issue Notices to Appear in court also apply to any outstanding body writs for failure to pay child support.

This Order rescinds any prior Administrative Order which is inconsistent with this Order, including but not limited to Orders 2016-2 and 2020-6.
