**System of Care** is a spectrum of **effective and community-based services and supports** for children and youth with or at risk for *[mental health]* and related challenges and their families that is organized into a **coordinated network** builds meaning **partnerships with families and youth** and addresses their **cultural and linguistic needs** in order to help them to **function** better at home, in school, in the community, and through life.

- \* Community Level (e.g. partnership with families, youth, and natural helpers, and community buy-in)
