Lots and lots of counties and townships and cities have decided to start mental health boards. So to tax their communities extra in order to pay for more community-based services, and as they've done that, so there are some problems associated with starting it, getting it started.

Some of those problems are highly political and some of the solutions are being sought through legislative action. And one of the actions that was taken last year created a problem

For boards like us. It created the need for additional elections every time somebody was appointed. This was an accident, but it was a function of solving these other communities' problems.

So we said, we, through our state association, said If you're gonna be messing around with the Community Mental Health Act, there's more than a few things in there that you should fix.

One is the annual report cannot be done within 90 days. No one is able to complete their audits of previous fiscal years that fast.

So that's one thing. To clean up this election requirement so that in a community like ours where there's just high turnover on the board, and that is OK, and that's a feature of our community, not a negative.

Really, and authority over more money than Department of Human Services does, so we've asked them to update the statute to include any other state authorities besides DHS, you know, in addition to DHS.
